

The fort of Montlandon (or Mortier)

Construction : 1883 – 1885.

Nature : Fort of belt.

Forme : Isosceles trapeze.

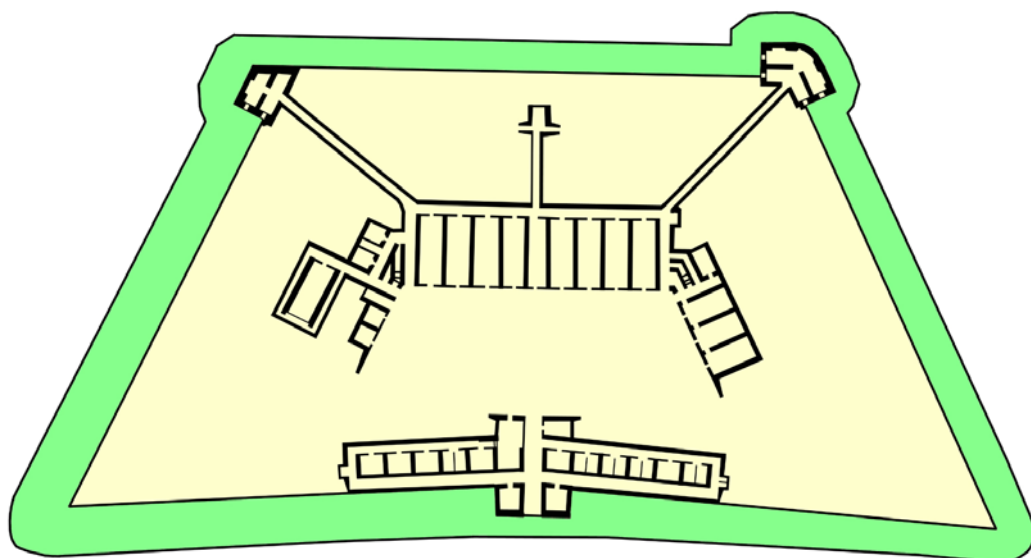
Situation : 6.21 miles in the East of Langres

Altitude : 0,25 miles.

Area : 8 hectares.

Capacity : 350 men among 7 officers.

Armament : 27 details with 17 details of rampart, 5 details with indirect shootings and 5 details of flanquement.

Unusual characteristic in the forts of Langres, the front of throat (today filled) was defended by bunkers of flanquement arranged on both sides of the axial entry.

A concreted lookout is always visible at the top of one of the shelters-crossbar. It is also one of the rare works of Langres to have preserved in perfect state the floor in oak of its shop with powder.

Same Work : Powder magazine of Madone (3,10 miles)

Supply in water :

Artificial waters: 1 water tank of stockage

Natural waters: 1 well of approximately 0,01 mile

Waste waters: Drainage on screeds then trenches towards ditches and catch basins or outside the fort. 2 latrines on fixed pits.

Owner : private property

No conducted visits

Story :

Its late construction makes of it the last fort of the device of Langres; he had to fill the vulnerable space between the forts of Plesnoy and Cognelot.

Situated near the road of Belfort, it assured the protection of this one and the plateau dominating the height-pond of the Saône. Of reduced dimension, it is one of the last works to
